## THREE SUBMARINERS TO BE ENSHRINED

On May 22, 1968, while returning to its home-port of Norfolk, Virginia upon completion of a 3-month Cold War deployment in the Mediterranean Sea, the USS Scorpion (SSN 589), a nuclear attack submarine, with a crew of 99 men, plunged to its watery grave some 10,000 feet beneath the surface of the Atlantic Ocean, 400 miles west of the Azores. On June 5, 1968, the U.S. Navy officially declared the USS Scorpion and its entire crew "missing and presumed lost at sea." Wreckage of the USS Scorpion was discovered on October 26,1968, by a U.S. Navy search and rescue vessel. To this date, the demise of the USS Scorpion remains shrouded in mystery. Among those crew members lost were three submariners from our Kentucky - Southern Indiana region, whose memories are to be honored through this enshrinement.
